Dak Nong



A newly-established province in the Central Highlands of Viet Nam with emerging socio-economic issues.

Alive & Thrive (A&T) is an initiative to improve infant and young child feeding (IYCF) practices by increasing rates of exclusive breastfeeding and improving complementary feeding practices. A&T aims to reach more than 16 million children under two years old in Bangladesh, Ethiopia and Viet Nam, and to create program models that can be replicated worldwide. In Viet Nam, A&T worked with the Ministry of Health, the National *Institute of Nutrition (NIN), the* Women's Union, the Viet Nam General Confederation of Labor (VGCL) and provincial authorities to double the rate of exclusive breastfeeding, improve the quality and quantity of complementary foods, and reduce stunting by two percentage points each year. These objectives were attained through different strategies including policy engagement, interpersonal counseling delivered through two distinct service delivery platforms, use of mass media, and the strategic use of data

Dak Nong is one of 15 A&T project sites in Viet Nam. Officially separated from Dak Lak Province in 2004, Dak Nong is one of the newest provinces in Viet Nam. The province has a large area of productive red basaltic soil which could enable the growth of agricultural crops at an industrial scale. Despite this potential, the poverty rate of Dak Nong remains high at 26.5% (compared to the national poverty rate of 12.9% in 2011)¹. Dak Nong has a population of approximately 525,700 people. About 54,800 children are under five years of age and 22,500 children under two years of age.

The Dak Nong Department of Health has partnered with A&T to achieve the following objectives:

- Double the rate of exclusive breastfeeding of infants under six months
- Improve the quality and quantity of complementary foods
- Reduce stunting by 2 percentage points each year

A&T's activities are implemented in two districts.

Mặt Trời Bé Thơ franchise model. This model is implemented in two of Dak Nong's eight districts in collaboration with health agencies at all levels. The first franchise was launched in May 2012 at the provincial Reproductive Health Center, and by 2014 there were a total of 15 Mặt Trời Bé Thơ franchises across the province. As of September 2014, a total of 67,000 counseling contacts have been delivered in Dak Nong, with a coverage rate of 95% in commune franchises. In September 2014, there were an average of 201 contacts in the network of franchises, of which 84% were repeat clients. The Dak Nong Department of Health is committed to supporting the operation of the franchises after the culmination of the project in 2015.

IYCF support group model. This model is implemented in nine communes in the Dak R'lap and Cu Jut districts of the province. There are 27 villages with IYCF support groups. These groups are comprised of pregnant mothers and caregivers with children 0–24 months old living in remote areas. As of September 2014, 22,000 counseling contacts have been delivered through the IYCF support groups.

Results. A&T survey data indicate that from 2011 to 2014, the percentage of children who are breastfed early within the first hour increased from 52% to 65%. There was a significant rise in the percentage of children under six months who were exclusively breastfed and who continued to be breastfed until two years, from 29% to 58% and 12% to 32% respectively. There was also an increase in the minimun acceptable diet from 65% to 77%, and in the minimum dietary diversity 77% to 86%. However, in the same period, the percentage of stunted children under the age of two also decreased from 28.1% to 22%.
