Alive & Thrive (A&T) is an initiative to improve infant and young child feeding (IYCF) practices by increasing rates of exclusive breastfeeding and improving complementary feeding practices. A&T aims to reach more than 16 million children under two years old in Bangladesh, Ethiopia and Viet Nam, and to create program models that can be replicated worldwide. In Viet Nam, A&T worked with the Ministry of Health, the National *Institute of Nutrition (NIN), the* Women's Union, the Viet Nam General Confederation of Labor (VGCL) and provincial authorities to double the rate of exclusive breastfeeding, improve the quality and quantity of complementary foods, and reduce stunting by two percentage points each year. These objectives were attained through different strategies including policy engagement, interpersonal counseling delivered through two distinct service delivery platforms, use of mass media, and the strategic use of data

Khanh Hoa is one of 15 A&T project sites in Viet Nam. Located in the South central coast, Khanh Hoa is economically one of the most developed areas in the Central Viet Nam after Da Nang. The poverty rate is 8.8% (*compared to the national poverty rate of 12.9% in 2011*)¹. Khanh Hoa has a population of approximately 1.2 million people. About 88,500 children are under five years of age and 36,400 children under two years of age.

The Khanh Hoa Department of Health has partnered with A&T to achieve the following objectives:

- Double the rate of exclusive breastfeeding of infants under six months
- Improve the quality and quantity of complementary foods
- Reduce stunting by 2 percentage points each year

A&T activities are implemented in Nha Trang City and three other districts.

Mặt Trời Bé Thơ franchise model. This model is implemented in Nha Trang city and two districts of Cam Ranh and Dien Khanh in collaboration with health agencies at all levels. The first franchise was launched in August 2011 at the provincial Reproductive Health Center, and by 2012 there were 45 Mặt Trời Bé Thơ franchises across the province. In 2014, an additional 15 franchises were established as part of the scaling-up process, bringing the total to 60 franchises. As of September 2014, a total of 151,000 contacts were delivered in the province of Khanh Hoa with a coverage rate of 81% at the commune level. In September 2014, there were an average of 134 contacts, of which 66% were repeat clients. In 2014, The Khanh Hoa Department of Health is committed to supporting the operation of the franchises after the culmination of the project in 2015.

IYCF support group model. There are 31 villages with IYCF support groups in the Khanh Son district. These groups are comprised of pregnant mothers and caregivers with children 0–24 months old living in remote areas.

Breastfeeding support in hospital. Khanh Hoa is one of four provinces that has approved the breastfeeding support in hospital guideline. The Khanh Hoa Department of Health issued an official guideline to support skin-to-skin contact and the early initiation of breastfeeding in Khanh Hoa General Hospital. Besides, Cam Ranh Hospital (in Khanh Hoa) also produced a guideline to support the application of skin-to-skin contact and the early initiation of breastfeeding in the hospital as well. So far the guideline has been applied to 90% of cases of vaginal deliveries.

Results. A&T survey data indicate that from 2011 to 2014, the percentage of children who are breastfed early within the first hour increased from 42% to 43%. There was a significant rise in the percentage of children under six months who were exclusively breastfed from 1% to 35%, and a slight increase in those who continued to be breastfed until two years, from 7% to 13%. There was also an increase in the minimun acceptable diet (from 70% to 85%), the minimum dietary diversity 84% to 94%. In the same period, the percentage of stunted children under the age of two also decreased from 13.3% to 8.1%.
